7. The Faberge Museum (14th - 17th of June)



The museum is located in the Shuvalov Palace on the embankment of the Fontanka River - one of the most beautiful palaces in St. Petersburg.

The museum's collection is based on the world's largest collection of Carl Faberge firm's works, which includes nine famous Imperial Easter eggs of incredible value.

There are 71 eggs in the collection, where 54 of them are imperial. These are not only items of the highest jewelry craftsmanship, but also unique historical artifacts. Nowadays the collection of the Faberge Museum has more than 4,000 exhibits, which also presents other areas in which the Fabergé firm worked: fantasy items, jewelry, silverware, interior and religious items, created by Russian masters in the second half of the XIX - early XX century.

In The Shuvalov Palace guide will tell you when and for whom unique works were created, which materials were used to create products and how they helped the master turn a small workshop into a world-class jewelry company that produced precious items for members of the royal family.
