Guadalajara, Mexico

Guadalajara is Mexico's second biggest city. This is the birthplace of mariachi music and tequila, but also one of the country's industrial and business centers, sometimes referred to as Mexico's Silicon Valley. Capital of the state of Jalisco, Guadalajara is an elegant city, and at the same time a partying city: there is no shortage of horsemanship, lively bars and tequila. A stroll through Guadalajara will give you an appreciation for the green spaces and public art in the city's many parks and plazas. At the heart of Guadalajara is the cathedral. The adjacent Government Palace has a lovely baroque facade and a spectacular mural in the interior main staircase, which was painted by Jose Clemente Orozco. Guadalajara's Ballet Folclorico performs in the Teatro Degollado in this beautiful neoclassical building dating to 1856. The Plaza Tapatio begins here and stretches over half a mile to the Hospicio Cabanas, a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Whether you choose to explore the city by foot, double decker bus or calandria (horse-drawn carriage), you'll find that Guadalajara's numerous plazas, colonial architecture and modern conveniences make this a delightful city to visit.

The surrounding of Guadalajara are also worth a visit. San Sebastian del Oeste, the best place to look at the stars, a small town where, looking at the horizon, the sky blends with the blue Pacific Ocean and, at night, the sky lights up with hundreds of stars. Lake Chapala, the largest water reservoir in Mexico, a place of natural beauty and tranquility, one of the most charming places in the world, perfect to relax. Tapalpa and Mazamitla, the magic towns offering fun adventures in their forests. Los Camarones Beach and the Garza Blanca Beach, two certified beaches with all kinds of water sports on its white sandy beach as well as an incredible abundance of crustaceans and local cuisine.

In Guadalajara and in Jalisco region you will enjoy year round spring temperatures, ever-flowering sprawiling gardens and parks. This is the home of authentic and world-known Mexican traditions that you don't want to miss.









The Actors Behind the IAC

The IAC is a joint effort between the International Astronautical Federation (IAF) and a local organiser.

The IAF, alongside its partners the International Academy of Astronautics (IAA) and the International Institute of Space Law (IISL), coordinates the overall programme and content of each IAC, and ensures the level of excellency that reflects the more than 65-year history of the event.

The local organising committee or 'host', coordinates the logistical elements of the Congress, ensuring local space actors and developments, and the local culture and customs become an integral part of the event.

Mexican Space Agency

The Mexican Space Agency (AEM) is a public decentralized organism, with legal personality, own budget, with technical and management autonomy in order to fulfil its attributions, objectives and goals. It is under the organization and coordinated by the Ministry of Communications and Transports (SCT).
