# Tensae Alemayehu Ali

### Who are you in 5 hashtags?

#Christian #Curious #Leader #TechSavvy #SpaceMan

### Why space? How did you enter the space sector?

My love for space began with ancient Ge'ez manuscripts, especially AXIMAROS by St. Epiphanius, Bishop of Cyprus. This discovery hit me hard: space isn't just a Western domain. Our African ancestors, pioneers of astronomy, wove the stars into their world—a legacy traced through Sabaean writings by the Ethiopian



scholar Ahamenes. Exploring these roots unveiled a deep stargazing tradition and astronomy tied to our continent's soul. Since then, space became a bridge, linking ancient insights to today's innovations, tackling global issues, and paving the way for inspiring my fellow Africans on a cosmic future.

That spark drove me to action. I founded a school club to share my comparative research on ancient Ethiopian astronomy, which earned me an invitation to present at the Ethiopian Space Science Society's General Assembly. Hungry for more, I immersed myself in research, determined to pursue engineering. Aerospace engineering wasn't an option in Ethiopia—often limited to military aviation rather than astronautics—so I studied a related field to build the right foundation for a master's in aerospace. My journey took off with the Space Generation Advisory Council, where I progressed from organizing the the 3rd African Space Generation Workshop in 2019, to becoming Ethiopia's National Point of Contact for SGAC all the way to taking part of the Executive Board as the Regional Coordinator for Africa, building networks and leading workshops on space entrepreneurship, space tech and policy.

Fast forward to today, I have been working as a Sales Engineer at CubeSpace Satellite Systems since 2022, translating complex technologies into solutions, securing international contracts, and driving Africa's economic growth through space—blending my roots with a global vision for the cosmos.

### Your first contact with the IAF?

My first contact with the IAF was through the IAC that was taking place in Dubai back in 2021.

### A significant person you met through the IAF?

Clay Mowry! An incredible #RocketMan from whom I've had the absolute privilege of gaining invaluable wisdom.

# Any experience/ opportunity (around the IAF) that changed your professional career?

Let me continue my story with Clay.

We first met at the Cultural Night hosted by SGAC during SGC, which takes place a few days before the IAC. At the time, Clay was the VP of



Blue Origin. As he took a seat at our table, he looked at me and said, "I recognize your face—maybe from Twitter!? Glad to meet you!" Right away, he pulled out one of Blue Origin's space-flown feather pins and handed it to me as a gift. I was absolutely starstruck! Fast forward to the end of the congress, and Clay was elected as the incoming IAF President.

A year later, I had the honor of receiving the ESL award, and in 2023, the Young Space Leaders Medal from him—standing alongside incredible figures from the space industry and academia.

Thanks to that opportunity and a simple conversation starter—a feather pin—I landed my current job, built connections across the world, unlocked opportunities I never even knew existed, and continue to propel my career in the industry.

#### A recommendation to the YPs for the next IAC?

First off, Sydney will be epic! Chris Boshuizen has personally told me so (also another cool person you'll be meeting at the IAC [3]!

When people say, 'IAC is the biggest space event where industry, academia, and agency players come together,' it's because there's no better way to describe it. In simple terms, it's where the MAGIC happens! Whether you're looking to further your studies, land a job, or even secure investors for your venture, IAC offers limitless possibilities to propel you toward the next, better version of yourself.

Be adequately prepared—have your business cards ready, polish your pitch, and have a clear idea of what you want to gain from the congress. Plan as much as you can—join WhatsApp/Telegram groups, stay informed about side events and evening receptions (there will be plenty, so you may have to choose wisely). But also, leave room for flyby opportunities—because in my experience, those spontaneous, unplanned encounters are where the real game-changing discussions happen!

### A life motto/quote you like and/or follow?

Lead today, not tomorrow!

### Any final thoughts you want to share?

Space is more than an industry; it's a frontier that connects history, innovation, and limitless possibilities. My journey—from ancient Ge'ez manuscripts to working in the global space sector—has shown me that we are never too small to make an impact. Opportunities exist for those who seek them, and IAC is proof of that. For young professionals, my advice is simple: be bold, be curious, and take that first step. You never know where one conversation, one idea, or one opportunity might lead you. The cosmos is vast—so is your potential!
